2'	Entry	The teacher reminds the children of the visit of the traf- fic education instructor.	CW	
15'	Reflection assignment	The pupils have the task to draw a picture and/or write down what they experienced in the lesson with the traffic education instructor.	IW	Sheet, booklet
18'		The pupils gather in a circle and exchange their memories. This exchange offers the opportunity to review what they have learned and experienced and, if necessary, to add or repeat things. Experiences on the way to school can also be taken up. The resulting pictures can be kept as a learning trace.	CW	Circle
10'	Closing	After the exchange, all children receive a pre-made card on which they can draft something again. On the back of the card, there is important information for the parents. This card is given to the pupils to take home at the end of the lesson.	IW	Pre-printed card (can be ordered at acs.ch/formation)
