Cycle 1 **Competences:** Languages, Mathematics and Natural Sciences L1 13 – 14, MSN 17Lesson objectives: Pupils know the benefits of wearing the luminous belt / luminous waistcoat and other reflective accessories on clothes, shoes and school bags (visibility). The children can describe the traffic area. They know the different vehicles of the entire traffic area, can describe them and assign them to the appropriate traffic routes. NMG 1.2: Pupils can share responsibility for health and well-being and can protect themselves from dangers. NMG 1.2b: Pupils can protect themselves from dangers and know appropriate protective measures. NMG 4.1: Pupils can recognise, compare and explain signals, senses and sensory abilities. NMG 4.1a: Pupils can recognise signals commonly used in everyday life and describe their meaning (e.g. fire brigade siren, traffic lights, hand signals).
